Learning Partners

After half term, we will be introducing Learning Partners across the school to further support children's learning and development.

Our approach is informed by the research of Shirley Clarke and focuses on developing high-quality talk and collaboration in the classroom. Each week, every child will be paired with a Learning Partner, chosen at random, and these pairings will change every Wednesday lunchtime.

This will give the children the opportunity to work with a range of peers, helping them to develop confidence, resilience and empathy. Through partner talk, children will practice explaining their thinking, using key vocabulary and embedding their learning more securely.

We are excited about the positive impact this will have on both learning and relationships across the school.
