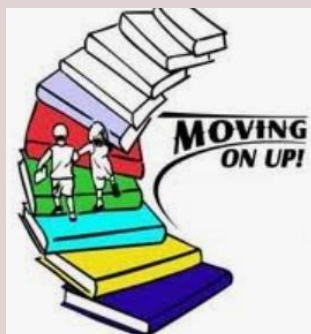
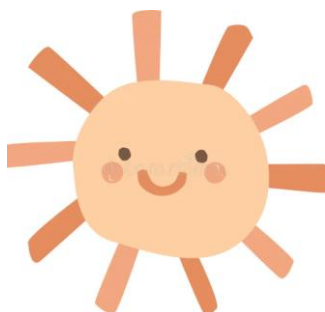
Update
